|       | <ul> <li>Prof. Dr. Bas Arts (Wageningen Forest and Nature Conservation Policy Group) will kick off by introducing landscape governance as an integrated approach, involving multiple stakeholder groups, and working across scales. Landscape governance not only considers the characteristics of the landscapes in question, but also the wider environmental, social and economic drivers that affect it, such as commodity chains, climate change, or social migration.</li> <li>Dr. Ed Dammers (Netherlands Environmental Assessment Agency) will lead us through the past, present and future of spatial planning in the Netherlands. He will emphasise the interplay between nature and culture, and focus on the landscape level as the ideal level to integrate various sectoral interests and to boost so-called regional qualities.</li> <li>Prof. Dr. Lars Hein (Environmental Systems Analysis Group) will introduce the topic of natural capital accounting, as a means to monitor landscape changes. Natural capital accounting is an important instrument for policy-makers to identify cost-effective environmental management options, and for landscape investors to invest.</li> </ul> |
