Food & Business Research: Background

The <u>Food & Business Knowledge Agenda</u> (2013), by the Ministries of Foreign Affairs and Economic Affairs

Aim: Strengthening the implementation of the Dutch development policy on food security as set out in the food security and private sector letters to parliament

F&B: Two research instruments

Global Challenges Programme (GCP)	Applied Research Fund (ARF)
Research based <u>enhanced understanding</u> of emerging key issues in global and regional food security and their impact on local food security and the role of private sector development	Research supported <u>concrete innovations</u> that contribute to the food security and related business needs in partner countries
Focus: Global	Focus: the 15 partner countries of Dutch Development Cooperation
Duration of projects: - Fast Track Research 2 years; - Integrated projects 4 - 5 years	Duration of projects: 2 – 3 years
Project budget: €500,000 – €1M	Project budget: €50,000 - €300,000
4 Calls : 14 Fast Track Projects 16 Integrated Projects	3 Calls: 45 projects (2 - 3 years duration)

Applied Research Fund (ARF)

Objective:

To promote research supported innovations that contribute to food security and private sector development in the 15 partner countries of Dutch development cooperation

Innovation in the primary process of food production and access to healthy food; innovation in enabling institutional arrangements; and policy innovations

- Demand driven questions: from Dutch partner countries
- Engagement with intermediary and ultimate target groups
- Alignment to Multi-Annual Strategic Plans of the Dutch embassies (MASP)



Foci are related to areas of Dutch food security policy

Call 1 and 2 (2014-2016):

- 1. Sustainable agriculture
- 2. Equitable access to nutrition
- 3. Inclusive access to markets
- 4. Better business climate

Call 3 (2017):

- Eradicating existing hunger and malnutrition
- 2. Promoting inclusive and sustainable growth in agricultural sector
- 3. Creating ecologically sustainable food systems
- A. Bangladesh: Food-climate-water-ecosystem nexus
- B. Kenya: Farming as a Business



- Total budget: € 4M per Call, plus <u>co-funding</u> of 20% by private partners (3 Calls: 45 projects awarded in total)
- Criteria in assessment procedure:
 - a) Contributing to development
 - b) Contributing to innovation
 - c) Project feasibility
- Consortia consist of at least two partners that integrate different kinds of knowledge and execute a project as an effort of co-creation:
 - A private or public practitioner organisation from a partner country in the lead
 - A research organisation from a partner country or the Netherlands
 - A Dutch partner is required





Practitioners in consortia

Practitioners organisations may include any type of organisation other than research or higher education organisations that represent a group of people actively engaged in food security:

- private for-profit enterprises and related support organisations;
- private non-profit organisations, such as non-governmental organisations, cooperatives, unions, civil society organisations, et cetera;

 public organisations such as governmental departments of line ministries or local governments, extension services.








ARF projects

Impression of ARF project activities

- Baseline studies / evaluation exisiting practices / indigenous knowledge / technical and market analyses
- Participatory testing, monitering, analysing / Lab testing / sampling / surveys /
- Experimentation with market traders & youth /consumer perspectives
- Installing assembly technology with local artisans / using local materials
- Demonstration centres / Seed multiplication centre



Impression of ARF project activities

- Workshops and meetings / focus group discussions
- Farmer field school / farmers producers training / tailored advice / farmer to farmer exchange visits/ community meetings / trainings / production and training modules / technical training
- Policy briefs / collaboration with policy makers & government
- Fact sheets / brochures / posters / recipies / radio / role plays / learning guidelines




Impression of ARF results & outcomes
