Food Systems Approach

When we look at food systems we consider activities, actors and network that interact along and around whole food value chain from growing and harvesting to processing, transporting, marketing, consumption and disposal. Not only at local, but also at regional and international scale. And within social, political, cultural, technological, economic and natural contexts, influenced by rules, laws, standards, agreements and policies. And in particular at the trade-offs and synergies with one another.

How can Ghanaian consumers access sufficient various quality food that is in accordance with their dietary wishes and health needs, and the drivers of change (type of policy, agriculture, inclusive trade, etc.) that are needed to achieve this sustainably?
